INTRODUCTION:

- The EPLUS Habitat Incentive Program is designed to incentivize and recognize participating EPLUS landowners who create and maintain significant habitat enhancements for elk on their private deeded property.
- Elk incentive authorizations are limited in number and are subject to annual availability in each Game Management Unit.
- Authorizations (number and type) awarded to each ranch may change from year to year based on availability.
- Authorizations are NOT guaranteed from year-to-year.
- All applications are evaluated and ranked through a competitive process by the Department.
- Applications are evaluated based on the scale of the habitat enhancement and their benefit to elk on the landscape.
- The Habitat Incentive program is not a compensation program for efforts or funds expended to improve habitat – only a limited way to recognize landowners for certain qualifying projects for a limited amount of time.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Properties must be currently enrolled in EPLUS with up to date ownership records on file.
- First year ranches are not eligible for the incentive program.
- Projects used to qualify for EPLUS are not eligible for incentive consideration.
- The Incentive program does not recognize routine ranch maintenance activities.
- Projects must be completed to be considered.
- Projects must have been completed within the past three years to be considered.
- If multiple properties are owned or managed by the same Authorized Ranch Contact, a separate application must be submitted for each property enrolled in EPLUS.
- Only projects on private deeded lands are eligible for the incentive program, projects on State or Federal leased lands are not eligible.

DEADLINES:

- Elk Incentive Applications must be submitted or postmarked by **January 5** to be considered for the next license year.
- **Late or incomplete applications will be rejected.**

INSTRUCTIONS (Read Carefully):

- Provide detailed specific information about each project you want considered for the Incentive Program.
- **Only information provided in the application form will be considered.**
- Two to three before and after photographs of each project and maps depicting project locations are **REQUIRED** and must be submitted at the time the application is submitted or those projects will not be considered.
- **DO NOT** send videos, pictures or trail camera photos of elk, elk tracks/droppings, or elk damage.
- Do not send slide shows, CD's, thumb drives or any alternate media in place of this application.
- Applications, information, or photos submitted from previous years **WILL NOT** be considered. A new application must be submitted each year for consideration.
- Starting and completion dates are required for each project to be considered.
- Projects planned for the future will not be considered.

WATER INSTRUCTIONS & PROJECT CONSIDERATIONS

- Development of water projects in parts of the state where water is scarce or sparsely distributed will constitute a higher priority than water development in areas where water is more abundant or widely distributed.
- Seasonal duration of available water will affect consideration of the water project. Water projects that provide water year-round will constitute a higher consideration.
- Water projects within ½ mile of existing water (on or off deeded property) will only be considered on a case by case basis.
- There may be a point where multiple water developments on a ranch may not improve the application.
- Only projects completed within the previous three-year window will be considered.
- Labeled photographs and maps of all water projects must be attached to the final application. Late submissions will not be accepted.

INELIGIBLE PROJECTS:

- Projects completed over three years ago will not be considered.
- Projects listed lacking a start and completion date will not be considered.
- Projects not completed by the application deadline will not be considered.
- Using “ongoing”, “in progress” or similar answer on date completed will result in the project not being considered.
- Projects such as cleaning dirt tanks or fixing floats are considered general maintenance and will not be considered.
- Projects conducted on Forest Service, BLM or State Trust grazing allotments will not be considered.

STOCK MANAGEMENT INSTRUCTIONS & PROJECT CONSIDERATIONS

- A structured stock management plan which includes reduced numbers or complete elimination of livestock may be considered.
- To be considered for grazing deferment or livestock reduction, the property must have a recent history of continual grazing and the deferment or reduction of cattle implemented within the past three years.
- Grazing deferment does not include moving cattle from deeded land to a grazing lease for a portion of the year. A deferment must be the total removal of cattle from deeded land for a period of at least one calendar year.
- The more calendar years cattle are deferred will result in increased consideration for this practice.
- To be considered for stock reduction, reduction numbers must be below the recommended stocking rate for the area of the state in which the deeded land is located.
- Reduction of numbers must be significant enough to impact forage quality on the property.

INELIGIBLE PROJECTS:

- Projects completed over three years ago will not be considered.
- Projects listed lacking a start and completion date will not be considered.
- Projects not completed by the application deadline will not be considered.
- Using “ongoing”, “in progress” or similar answer on date completed will result in the project not being considered.
- Projects conducted on Forest Service, BLM or State Trust grazing allotments will not be considered.

FOREST MANAGEMENT INSTRUCTIONS & PROJECT CONSIDERATIONS

- Projects that improve forest management/health by select cutting/thinning which reduces canopy cover and encourages grass and forb growth in the understory are examples of projects that can be considered.
- Fuel load reduction projects along with thinning to re-establish or establish an open pine savannah like environment are typical projects considered.
- Increasing the total number of acres affected may increase the consideration of these projects.
- Most qualifying projects in the category will have either a USDA or a New Mexico Forestry Division management plan.
- Labeled photographs and maps of all Forest Management projects must be attached to the final application. Late submissions will not be accepted.

AGRICULTURE INSTRUCTIONS & PROJECT CONSIDERATIONS

- For the purposes of the Habitat Incentive Program agriculture is defined as a mechanically harvested field crop either for sale or utilization directly on the ranch.
- Crops (pasture) grazed by livestock and not mechanically harvested do not qualify as production agriculture in this program.
- Crops such as alfalfa will score higher than those made up of native or introduced grasses. Marginally productive crops will not score as well.
- Applications lacking information on the type of crop, the type of irrigation system, and harvest regime will not be scored.
- Labeled photographs and maps of all agricultural projects must be attached to the final application. Late submissions will not be accepted.

INELIGIBLE PROJECTS:

- Orchards are not considered as agriculture in this program.
- Food plots will not be scored as agriculture. Projects of this type should be submitted as rangeland projects.
- Projects conducted on Forest Service, BLM or State Trust grazing allotments will not be considered.

FENCE MODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS & PROJECT CONSIDERATIONS

- Standard Fence Modifications that may be considered include: elk crossings, addition of high visibility material to existing fence, installation of smooth wire on top and bottom, wildlife friendly fence, and removal of sheep fencing or old fencing materials no longer in use.

- Laydown fencing is also considered as a fence modification that is beneficial for elk.
- Laydown fencing consists of either 4 or 5 wire fencing that can be laid down as a unit to allow wildlife movement.
- Consideration will be given for the linear distance of laydown fencing utilized on the ranch, the timing and duration of the fence being down, and the frequency of elk presence, movement and/or migration through the ranch.
- Labeled photographs and maps of all fence modification projects must be attached to the final application. Late submissions will not be accepted.

STREAM/SPRING INSTRUCTIONS & PROJECT CONSIDERATIONS

- Stream Projects for this program will only be considered for permanent or intermittent streams/rivers with reliable seasonal water flow. This does not include rain runoff channels or arroyos.
- Projects considered can include spring rehabilitation, adjacent erosion control, protection (exclusionary fencing for cattle), bank stabilization (plantings), and catchments (pools/ponds or spring boxes).
- Labeled photographs and maps of all stream/spring projects must be attached to the final application. Late submissions will not be accepted.

INELIGIBLE PROJECTS:

- Road ditch modifications will not be considered.

- Projects lacking a start and completion date will not be considered.
- Projects not completed by the application deadline will not be considered.
- Using “ongoing”, “in progress” or similar answer on date completed will result in the project not being considered.
- Projects completed over three years ago will not be considered.
- Projects conducted on Forest Service, BLM or State Trust grazing allotments will not be considered.
