




La Jara / Rio Fernando de Taos Wetland Restoration Project

Background Information



- These wetlands provide water and habitat for a variety of wildlife including elk, deer, and turkey.
- Restoration actions will focus on reconnecting the channel with the floodplain, improving wetland function, and increasing water levels in the Rio Fernando de Taos.
- This project is the final piece (project area 7) of a multiyear restoration project on the Rio Fernando. The work started in 2019 with restoration projects completed upstream of this project area.

Proposed Management Action

- NMDGF, in collaboration with the Camino Real RD, Amigos Bravos, and TNC, will contract the installation of instream structures and livestock exclosure fence.
- Total implementation costs estimate for the project is \$300,000 which includes instream restoration and pipe fence construction.
- Tenative Project timeline is: Instream restoration completed by Oct 2022, Fence installation in Dec 2022/Jan 2023, project finalization/wrapup by June 2023.
