## QUALIFIED EXPERT IMPORTATION APPLICATION



The New Mexico Department of Game & Fish (NMDGF) Law Enforcement Division will assist the importation of live non-domestic animals, birds and fish. The Qualified Expert Importation Application is for those who wish to import into the State of New Mexico and possess specific species listed or considered a group IV in the "Species Importation List."

## **REGULATION INFORMATION:** Importation of live non-domestic animals, birds and fish [19.35.7 NMAC]

- **Species Importation List:** NMDGF has developed a species importation list that is grouped into the following minimum importation "groups" based on the following criteria.
- Group I are designated semi-domesticated animals and do not require an importation permit.
- **Group II** may be for live non-domesticated animals that are not known to be either invasive or dangerous and do not present a known risk to the health, safety or well-being of the public, domestic livestock or to native wildlife and their habitats.
- **Group III** may be for live non-domesticated animals that present minimal or manageable concerns that will require specific provisions that must be met prior to issuing an importation permit to address health, safety or well-being of the public, domestic livestock or to native wildlife and their habitats.
- **Group IV** may be for live non-domesticated animals that are considered dangerous, invasive, undesirable, state or federal listed threatened, endangered, a furbearer or any other species of concern as identified by the director. The importation of these species are prohibited for the general public but may be allowed for, scientific study, department approved restoration and recovery plans, zoological display, temporary events/entertainment, use as service animal **or by a qualified expert.**
- Any species of live non-domesticated animal not currently on the species importation list will be designated group IV until such time as another determination is made by the director.
- Qualified expert a person officially designated by the director to import a specific non-domesticated animal. The director shall determine the process and the requirements for a person to be designated a qualified expert for each applicable species. The director may require an applicant to provide specific qualifications including, but not limited to the following: professional references, experience, training, education and facility specifications. The determination to approve or deny a qualified expert designation by the director is final and is not subject to appeal.

#### **APPLICATION FOR IMPORTATION:** All applicants will be required to supply the following documents:

- Containment or confinement plan
- Health verification requirements
- City/County license or their letter of approval
- Any necessary State or Federal permits

#### SUPPLEMENTAL DOCUMENTATION:

**Dangerous or Venomous Animal -** professional resume, affiliations and references, facility specifications, security measures and photographs, emergency action plan and emergency contacts, release of liability indemnification agreement, copy of notices and warnings that will be displayed.

**Protected Animals -** State and/or Federal Permits (i.e. falconry, game bird propagation, scientific/education, federal migratory bird permit, threatened/endangered species permit)

In certain circumstances, the department may require additional documentation.

# REQUIREMENTS OF DANGEROUS OR VENOMOUS ANIMALS

The New Mexico Department of Game & Fish (NMDGF) requires Qualified Experts (QE) of dangerous or venomous animals to meet the following minimum requirements and precautionary steps:

- If applicable, the animal must be sterilized, de-clawed and/or micro chipped
- If applicable, the animal must be registered with the city and county animal regulatory or licensing agencies
- Containment/Confinement description and photographs submitted to NMDGF
- The animal must be kept in a securely locked cage/area
- If outside, the animal must be in a securely locked cage/area to prevent escape or injury
- Double lock access entry ways to any cage/area where the main door is entered through the exterior to prevent escape
- All entry points (doors, windows, cage door or terrarium) must remain secure at all times
- Secure windows, vents, or any other access gaps large enough for animal to escape through (sturdy mesh, screen or metal bars)
- Emergency Plan of Action on file with NMDGF, in case of emergency evacuation, natural disaster or hospitalization/death of QE
- A Qualified Expert may be required to purchase liability insurance to cover any bodily injuries inflicted by the dangerous animal
- Written agreement/acknowledgement between the QE and any recipient of a dangerous animal (i.e. transfer of ownership)
- Other requirements as specified by any federal, state, county or city laws, regulations or ordinances.

# **SIGN POSTAGE - WARNING OF DANGEROUS OR VENOMOUS ANIMAL(S)**

In addition to the requirements for potentially dangerous animals, QE's must also meet the following sign postage requirements:

- Signs shall bear letters not less than one (1) inch high, stating "DANGEROUS/VENOMOUS ANIMAL ON PREMISES"
- Such signs shall also display a pictorial symbol, that is understandable by small children, that warns of the presence of such animal
- Such signs shall be conspicuously posted at either all entrances of building, interior confinement rooms/areas or outdoor cages
- A sign shall be posted on each cage with specific species information (scientific name, common name) for emergency response
